

How to Create Your Own Key Volunteer Agreement

Step #1: Communicating your Vision:

- What vision has God put on your heart that you want to share with potential Key Volunteers?
- What Biblical promises and perspective do you want to share? (you can refer back to the God's Promises/My Vision section for both of these)

Step #2: Calling for Clear Commitment

- What is the minimal commitment we need to see in a student or volunteer in order to hope that God could build a movement through them?
 1. Heart for God
 2. Heart for Growth in following Christ
 3. Growing Heart for the lost and for the Great Commission
 4. Availability. Ready to give a reasonable amount of time and priority to building a movement
 5. Initiative/Action. Many effective KV's are quite ordinary students, but one thing that characterizes them is that they take action in faith, applying what they are learning.)
- What Biblical passages can you use to challenge potential Key Volunteers to this core level of commitment?
- What specific commitments or actions do you want to challenge them to?

Step #3: Committing to Care

We will explore this more later in the training, but when someone commits to being a KV, we are also making a commitment to them to disciple, develop, and coach them as they trust God for a movement in their university.

- *What specifically do you want to communicate to them about your commitment?*
- *Make a list of the things you are committing to do in the KV Agreement.*

Step #4: Writing Your Own KV Agreement

Take time now to write your own KV Agreement or outline of the appointment you will have with PKVs.
